Decision Guide For Partnership Research: To Partner or Not To Partner? Information for Researchers

Partnership research is about meaningful collaboration between researchers and people with lived experience of the topic. *Lived experience experts* might include patients or their family members. Partnership research is especially helpful for ensuring the study being conducted is relevant and valuable for the people it affects most. Deciding to partner in research can be challenging for both the lived experience expert and the researcher. Taking time to consider some key areas can help you make an informed decision about whether partnering in a project is right for you. The following guide offers key information and prompts for reflection to help you make an informed decision. Begin by considering each question below and place an X along the sliding scale. Next, discuss your guide with your potential lived experience expert partner. The lived experience expert should complete the Lived Experience Expert companion decision guide and discuss their results with you as well.
