

Doreen Bartlett (djbartle@uwo.ca) is an Associate Professor in the School of Physical Therapy at the University of Western Ontario. She teaches courses relating to pediatric physical therapy, critical appraisal of the research literature, and broad issues with respect to health professional education. She is an Associate Member of *CanChild* Centre for Childhood Disability Research, where she has been and is currently involved in the following additional projects relating to children with cerebral palsy: 1) The Ontario Motor Growth Curve Study (with Peter Rosenbaum as PI), 2) the Adolescent Study of Quality of Life, Mobility and Exercise (with Peter Rosenbaum as PI, and Bob Palisano as Co-Investigator), and 3) Moving Motor Growth Research into Clinical Practice (with Dianne Russell and Peter Rosenbaum as Co-PIs). As part of the ASQME project, Doreen is currently collaborating with Palisano and Rosenbaum on the extension of the Gross Motor Function Classification System to an adolescent band (for individuals 13-18 years of age). Additional research interests include infant motor development and the development of clinical expertise. Doreen served as one of the seven decision editors of the journal *Physical Therapy* from 2002 to 2007, and is currently on the editorial boards of *Pediatric Physical Therapy* and *Physical and Occupational Therapy in Pediatrics*. She is also on the Canadian Physiotherapy Association's (CPA) Task Force to develop core evaluation criteria for clinical physiotherapy specialization in Canada and is a member of the CPA Pediatric Specialization Committee.
