







How to Use This Document

Researchers sometimes have funds available to support training people who are working with them on research or other projects. However, asking for funding from researchers is not something family members do all the time. Sometimes it's because family members don't know that they can ask, and sometimes it's because they don't feel comfortable asking.

We acknowledge that asking for funding is not always easy to do. We want to provide you with a tool you can use to open a conversation with a researcher or supervisor who you work with. You can adapt the email template below to ask the researcher or supervisor if they would consider providing you with needed funds to support your learning as a family partner.

Students also receive a certificate of completion upon successfully completing the FER course.
