







How to Use This Document

Researchers sometimes have funds available to support training activities for those who are working with them. However, asking a supervisor for funding support for training opportunities is not something frequently done by trainees and research staff members (e.g., research assistant, research coordinator etc.). As a trainee or a research staff member, it may be awkward or uncomfortable to bring this up to your supervisor.

We acknowledge that asking for funding is not always easy to do. We want to provide you with a tool you can use to start this conversation. You can adapt the email template below to ask your supervisor if they would consider providing you with the needed funds to support your learning about family engagement in research.

Subject: *Learning Opportunity through Family Engagement in Research Course* Dear [supervisor's name],

I recently learned about a course called the Family Engagement in Research (FER) Certificate of Completion Program that teaches researchers and family members how to work together on research projects. This course is offered online through McMaster University Continuing Education in partnership with CanChild Centre for Childhood Disability Research and Kids Brain Health Network. The student cohort includes family members (e.g., parents, caregivers, siblings, etc.) and researchers (e.g., staff, trainees, scientists, etc.). Students in this course learn the importance of family perspectives in research; how to engage together to shape research projects; which tools and resources are available to support family engagement in research; and practice collaboratively working together via a group project to co-create a knowledge translation tool related to family engagement in research. Students also receive a certificate of completion upon successfully completing the FER course.
